The Wentling Family has immersed themselves in volunteerism during their entire time in the Army. The SGT Matthew, Marissa, Marisol, and Kaleb hit the ground running after arriving at Fort Benning in 2015 by establishing a local hub for Operation Homefront. The family's impact has stretched well beyond the defense community and has benefited child and youth

services, The Columbus Lions, The Columbus Cottonmouths, Camp Corral, McBride Elementary and Faith Middle School, and many others. Most recently the family completed a school supply drive, and through their efforts, provided over 625 local military children with school supplies and backpacks for the 2017-2018 academic school year. The Wentling Family has inspired other military families to dedicate their time to serve as volunteers.

BREAKOUT SESSION I: MILITARY FAMILY CHALLENGES Military Spouse Employment and Child Education

From the outside, military families appear to consist of stay-at-home spouses who keep house throughout deployments and care for the children. However, there is a flaw in this perception; military spouses increasingly seek their own careers to provide additional financial stability to their families and for personal career satisfaction. Nonetheless, military spouses who seek work account for high unemployment and underemployment rates. Although the majority of school-aged military children attend public schools, most public schools systems are not equipped to manage the stresses of military-connected children. Perhaps one the most neglected populations in public education is military-connected students. This panel includes leading military family advocates who will discuss the many obstacles of spouse employment and child education for military families.
