Mr. Dan Klippstein was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in March 2013 and assumed his current position in May 2020. He advises and assists the Deputy Chief of Staff (DCS), G-9 on policy guidance, planning, programming and budgeting of Army resources to meet Army senior leader's priorities of readiness, modernization, reform and quality of life on all Army installations, globally and across all Components (AC, USAR and ARNG), to support Soldiers, Families and Civilians. He supports the DCS G-9 by providing oversight and direction to four GO/SES Directorates and one GS-15 lead Directorate comprising over 280 military and civilian personnel.

From September 2018 to May 2020, Mr. Klippstein served as the Director of Resource Integration, DCS G-9. He was responsible for all aspects of planning, programming and budget formulation for the Installation and Infrastructure Program Evaluation Group's (II PEG) \$17 billion annual program [\$85 billion across the Program Objective Memorandum (POM)] in support of Army priorities.

From May 2013 to September 2018, Mr. Klippstein served as the Director of the U.S. Army Nuclear and Combatting Weapons of Mass Destruction Agency and concurrently as the Deputy Director, Plans and Policy, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G3/5/7. He provided direction to 11x COL/GS15 led divisions and 1 Field Operating Agency comprised of over 150 military and civilian personnel and ~\$6 billion across the Fiscal Year Defense Plan. He developed Army strategies and plans to influence National and Defense strategies, synchronized Army warplans and global posture to support Combatant Commanders, synchronized Army Space and Army missile defense strategic planning; and directed Army nuclear and countering Weapons of Mass Destruction planning support of Army and Combatant Commanders.
